CHW PROGRESS REPORT Birthing Kits Arrive in Chilumba, Malawi! Save a Life for \$1.32 CAN

What would happen in Canada if you arrived at the hospital to give birth, only to be sent home because you didn't bring your own delivery room supplies? In some parts of the world, this happens on a regular basis, sometimes with fatal results. Some 800 women die daily from complications related to pregnancy and childbirth, complications that could be easily prevented with access to proper care and the most basic supplies. In Sub-Saharan Africa the maternal mortality ratio is 460 per 100,000 live births. In developed countries like Canada the ratio is 16 per 100,000 live births!

By providing birth kits for the midwives to use, maternal and infant deaths can be prevented because if a mother goes into labour and no provisions for birth are available, birthing kits provided by Change Her World will enable the birth attendant (usually a midwife) to ensure that infection is prevented—a leading cause of death. Simple items like a pair of gloves, soap and a clean plastic sheet to aid in delivery and a clean razor blade to cut the umbilical cord are significant items to prevent infections. Supplying these birthing kits means that no mother will be turned away when she arrives in labour.

Contents of Birthing Kits:

1- 3x3 foot of plastic sheeting for the mother to lie on
1 pair examining gloves
1 one ounce bar of soap

I face cloth
5 - 3x3 inch pieces of gauze
2 - 12 inch pieces of string
1 razor blade

All are placed in a Ziploc bag.

Because of the many donations received for this project, the cost was \$1.32 per kit which includes shipping!

We extend our gratitude to Superior Medical who donated 1000 pair of gloves and 5000 gauze pads. In addition to the 991 kits we were able to assemble and ship, Superior Medical also provided Change Her World with 7 Fetal Doppler Monitors for the clinics and hospital as well as medical anatomy charts related to pregnancy and delivery. Thank you Superior Medical! Fendrihan donated 1000 razor blades. An amazing mother and daughter from London collected nearly 1900 small bars of soap. Many volunteer hours were required to prepare the materials for the assemble of each kit which included cutting string, taping razor blades to soap to avoid loss, cutting all the plastic sheeting and counting out 5 gauze pads per kit.

Millennium Development Goals: A Status Report!

You may remember that in 2000, the global community (including Canadians) created what was known as the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) with a target date of 2015 to achieve them.

These goals included:

- \Rightarrow Eradicate Extreme Poverty and Hunger
- \Rightarrow Achieve Universal Primary Education
- \Rightarrow Promote Gender Equality and Empower Women
- \Rightarrow Reduce Child Mortality
- \Rightarrow Improve Maternal Health
- \Rightarrow Combat HIV/AIDS, Malaria and other Diseases
- \Rightarrow Ensure Environmental Sustainability
- \Rightarrow Create a Global Partnership for Development

With the deadline for the MDGs on the horizon, some progress can be reported in achieving many of these goals

but many developing countries including Malawi, have a long way to go. Redoubled efforts are urgently needed, particularly in regions most behind.

The good news is that the proportion of people living in extreme poverty has been halved and over 2 billion people gained access to improved sources of drinking water. This means that the MDG drinking water target was met five years ahead of the target date. However, there is still great need for better access to clean and safe drinking water in the developing world.

Remarkable gains have been made in the fight against malaria and tuberculosis. Mortality rates from malaria fell by more than 25 percent globally. Many countries across all regions have reduced the numbers of slum dwellers in the cities and metropolises of the world.

The hunger target is within reach. The number of undernourished people in the developing world decreased from 23.2% in

regions and in the first months of life.

suffering from hunger by the end of 2015 appears to be within reach. Still, one in eight people in the world today remain chronically undernourished.

The growth in global emissions of carbon dioxide is accelerating and emissions today are 46% higher than their 1990 level. Forests continue to be lost at alarming rates. Birds, mammals and marine species are heading for extinction at an even faster rate. Environmental sustainability is under severe threat demanding a new level of global cooperation.

There have been big gains in child survival but more must be done! Worldwide the mortality rate for children under five dropped by 46% but more must be done to meet the 2015 target of two-thirds reduction in child deaths. Increasingly, child deaths are concentrated in the poorest

Most maternal deaths are preventable but the progress in this area is falling short. Meeting the MDG of reducing the ratio by three quarters will require accelerated interventions and stronger political backing for women and children beyond 2015.

While new cases of HIV/AIDS infections are declining, the MDG of universal access to the anti-retroviral drugs by 2010 was missed but is attainable by 2015 to 2020 if current trends continue. The ultimate goal is eradicating the spread of HIV/AIDS but knowledge of the virus and how to avoid transmission remains unacceptably low. (Continued on Page 3)


New Design for changeherworld.ca

Despite progress in reducing the number of children out of school by half between 2000 and 2011, stalled progress means that the world is unlikely to meet the target of universal primary education by 2015. The poorest children are three times more likely to not attend school. Girls are much more likely than boys to be deprived of the experience of going to school.

Women continue to be denied equal opportunity with men to participate in the decisions that affect their lives.

Gains in sanitation are impressive but not good enough. From 1990-2011, 1.9 billion people gained access to a latrine, flush toilet or other improved sanitation facility. In Malawi, just over 50 % of the population have access to a pit latrine let alone a flush toilet.

In our global world, there is less aid money overall with the poorest countries most adversely affected. For example, the ruralurban gap still exists reducing access to reproductive health services and clean drinking water to many in our world.

Efforts to achieve a world of prosperity, equity, freedom, dignity and peace must continue beyond 2015.

Devaluing of the Malawi Kwacha!

Many Change Her World donors are not aware that when funds are wired to our projects in Malawi, all funds must be sent in US dollars



and then converted to Malawi Kwacha. We all know that right now the purchase of US dollars is extremely high. When our funds were wired at the beginning of August 2015 to pay for the Fall school fees and provisions for the CHW girls, the conversion rate we had to pay was \$1.31 CAN for \$1.00 US. On thousand of dollars, the monies paid for exchange is significant.

The Malawi monetary system has also been impacted by the strengthening of the US dollar. When Carol and Linda visited Malawi in 2006, \$1.00 US would purchase MK160. As of August 2015 \$1.00 US will purchase MK525. Because of the devaluing of the Malawi Kwacha, all commodities have increased in cost including school fees. This is making it very difficult for a person earning less than \$30.00 a month to buy basic things like maize, medicine and toiletries.

Change Her World has been affected by these changes so your donations mean even more to us.

18 + Ending Child Marriage

There is a new program being implemented in four Southern African countries by Plan Canada and the Center for Research on Women called—18+ Ending Child Marriage. One of the countries being targeted for this innovative program is Malawi. The goal is to prevent child marriage and to address the problem on multi-levels in all spheres of society.

Child marriage affects nearly 70 million girls in the world. Child marriage is a violation of girls' basic rights and it profoundly impacts their life path. It curtails childhood, limits education and economic opportunities, subjects girls to early and highrisk pregnancies and creates social isolation and increases vulnerability to violence.

There is an increasing global awareness of child early and forced marriage and its impact on not just girls' human rights but development outcomes.
