In the Fall 2016 Progress Report, Lizzie was praised for her volunteer work in beautifying the outdoor play area of our nursery school. The sad news was received that she died just a few months after the Board of Directors met with her in June 2016. Lizzie blessed our girls in a very special way!

This article (left) was published in the Stratford Beacon Herald in December 2016. The Chilumba committee informed the Board at the end of November 2016 that the motorbike used to visit the remote areas of our project was beyond repair. A new bike needed to be

purchased. Having just sent all available funds to pay for the second term school fees for the 200 plus girls being supported by CHW, an appeal for help was made to the local Stratford Community. A miracle happened! A generous group of donors (from Stratford and Brampton) made this purchase possible and our new Yamaha DT 125 motorbike was delivered to the project in February 2017!



# Lidia—The Story of a Young Hopeless Girl

Lidia Gondwe is living a hopeless life. She is a 14 year old orphan and a school drop out having lost both of her parents. Her days consist of sitting on a mat with her grandmother who takes care of her but she too is vulnerable and weak with old age.

When you meet her, you might be tempted to think she is junior primary girl considering her babyish voice and tender face but in reality, she has already completed primary school education and furthermore was chosen to attend secondary school. She has not been attending secondary school because there is no money for school fees. Lidia's grandmother is her sole source of support and she loves her dearly.

When I visited her I felt very sympathetic because of the poor clothing, home and food Lidia and her grandmother had.



Lidia was on of the girls writing the CHW exam as part of the needs assessment for admission to the CHW program as a beneficiary.

On November 5, 2016 the CHW Project Committee held interviews for new beneficiaries. Lidia attended and amazed the committee members with how well she responded to both the oral and written questions. She scored 70% and placed 6th out of the 47 girls who were present for the exercise.

Now with the coming of Change Her World in her life, things have changed. She is now a happy girl. She has found a parent who will clothe her, feed her and for sure, change her destiny. Joy filled her

face when I visited her again in her home and told her the good news that she will be back in school. She could not believe it and constantly said thank you for the support.

# **CHW Girls Empowerment Meetings**

In December 2016, meetings with the CHW girls who are in secondary school were held to address a number of issues which challenge them and may impede their futures. Recent additions to the Chilumba Project Committee are Atupele Ngonga and Telina Kitalu. These young women are university students with an interest and enthusiasm to work with Change Her World in order to empower young girls to be successful both in their studies but also in their consideration of what career choices they might make.

The meetings were led by Atupele and Telina where a broad range of topics were discussed including the importance of education, possible obstacles hindering academic success and the hazards of early marriage. Through example, Atupele and Telina also served as positive role models. This experience revealed that is easier for the beneficiaries to discuss problems with someone of the same gender. We are grateful to have these young women assist the project in these ways!

# **Preparing New Teacher Resource Kits For Chilumba**

### "Once a teacher...always a teacher."

This saying came to mind as Linda Willis (CHW Chair in Canada) viewed the literary resources being amassed by Canadian teachers for use by teachers in Mazungamika Zone in Northern Malawi.

Under the passionate eye of Shirley Weitzel (a retired teacher living in Stratford), six enthusiastic retired teachers have been recruited to gather or create the large amount of teaching resources and aids required to support the acquisition of language and of reading skills for the teachers in Malawi. Phonics drills, vocabulary cards, sets of the alphabet letters, semi-concrete material to practice and reinforce early learning skills, have slowly been gathered since September 2016. The variety and sheer amount of supplies is impressive.

Many softcover storybooks have also been acquired suitable for reading or with pictures useful for language development or for story writing. The Grade 6 class at Little Falls School in

St.Marys collected numerous storybooks thanks to Jane Baynes and Mrs. Cairncross. Their willingness assist in this endeavour will have a huge impact in Malawi!

This is a project that could never have be done by the Board of Directors alone and they are indebted to all who have contributed to the materials which have been gathered. A special thank-you should be expressed to Cathy Edgar in Wroxeter who made fifteen kits consisting of all the elements of early reading skills and Leigh Ognibene who has sewn small canvas bags which a Malawian child will use to carry home a book for their family to share. For children and their families in Malawi, this may be the first time to have printed material in their home. One cannot imagine the impact or repercussions of such an event! Thanks also to Barb Smithers, Heather Browning, and Kathy Currie. We are all lifelong learners!

Change Her World is now looking at providing math materials to aid in the teaching of math skills taught at the Grade 1, 2 and 3 levels in Malawi.

## **CHW Shipment Arrives**

In late December 2016, we received the news that our November shipment had arrived in Chilumba! Contained in the 59 cartons were toothbrushes and paste, flip flops, nursery school supplies including dried soup for the feeding program, reusable sanitary protection kits, clothing for the girls and women along with jackets for our volunteers embossed with the CHW logo (donated by Superior Medical).



### **New Premises Required for Collection Campaign**



Since the charity began in 2010, one of the significant contributions to the work of the charity has been the items donated by Canadians for the girls and women in Northern Malawi. Tons of contributions have been sent all collected and packed in Linda's basement. However, climbing up and down stairs and working in a confined area is no longer feasible. We could rent space for thousands of dollars a month but as a Board, we have worked hard to keep our overhead expenses to a minimum. We are looking for a **ground level heated donated space** where supplies could be collected, sorted and
