Hunger Season Arrives in Northern Malawi



An amazing response came as a result of our Chilumba team telling us during a video call on January 21 about how concerning this particular hunger season was. We were asked if we could assist. We issued the appeal January 31 and by Monday February 6, more than \$5,500.00 had been received – a heartwarming response. We were delighted by your support and quickly sent off funds to purchase the maize and cover the transport costs. The Board wishes to express our most sincere gratitude for the outpouring of donations that were received We, as a Board and you as donors can be gratified that we could do something to help this part of the world in a their time of hunger. Any amount in excess of

what was allotted to the purchase of maize will be used to begin the creation of an orchard and a garden on the CHW property which will also address the reality of food scarcity in the area.

Currently the present coordinator and the founding coordinator are making Passport and Visa arrangements for travel from Malawi to Canada. We hope to welcome them to the Stratford area and for them to be present for the April 15 Annual Dinner. You may recall that plans to bring our first two graduates were thwarted by the pandemic in 2020 so we are very hopeful that all will go according to plan this time. Please plan to join us to hear from **Fiskani Chirwa**, who is now an Advisor to the Chilumba Project. She will be speaking about her role in the founding of Change Her World in Chilumba.

Wezzie Moyo, who currently is responsible for the management of the project with a team of 9 committee members and aided by 70 other volunteers, will also be speaking. It should a wonderful night of remembrance, gratitude, excitement and inspiration. You will hear, firsthand, the impact on the lives of so many girls and young women in Malawi that Canadian donors have supported.

To date we have shipped 17,767 pairs of underwear to girls and women in the Chilumba area. In order to make it an even 20,000 pairs, we are asking that you bring girls and women cotton, full brief underwear (Girls - Size 4 and up and Women - Size S/M/ L) to the Annual Dinner on April 15.They will be shipped along with other items later in April. The goal 2,233 pairs!



fund this significant expense. We have ordered tables, chairs and shelving for the main library as well as for the children's corner. A table and 8 chairs have been ordered for the office as well.

A shipment of children's books is due to go in late April and many avenues are constantly being explored in Malawi to provide books of interest in a variety of subject areas for all age groups in addition to other publications that we may be able to access in order to serve as many people as possible. A set of secondary textbooks has been ordered and received and we are planning to order another set as soon as we are able.



Chairs for the Children's Corner have been purchased. Textbooks and Charts have also been purchased for the library.



Six computers for students and public use and one for the librarian, who is still in training, will be placed in the library. Our guests from Malawi will take back the 4 wall maps we have purchased - a map of Africa, Malawi, the world and one of Canada.

A memorandum of understanding regarding how the library will function will be a joint task with the Board in Canada and the project team in Chilumba in the coming months. Many decorations, puzzles, books and charts will create an inviting space for children and provide an early exposure to literature that, until now, has not been possible.

It is our hope that representatives of the Board will make the trip to Malawi during the summer to celebrate the grand opening of this library—a momentous accomplishment for future literacy possibilities in the community of Chilumba!

Increasing Our Number of Beneficiaries

In the Fall of 2023, 19 girls will graduate from their post- secondary programs. For the Chilumba project, that is a total of 43 college or university graduates. There were 10 girls that graduated tertiary programs from the former project in Mzuzu/Ekwendeni. This is a very exciting reality!

As of the present time this leaves 11 girls enrolled in tertiary programs after the fall graduation. It is our plan to increase the number of girls substantially at the secondary level as the average yearly cost of secondary (\$500) is much less than the average yearly cost of college/university (\$2,500). It is our plan to admit approximately 50 or more additional beneficiaries in September 2023.

Linda Willis and Carol Hamilton-Williams (Co-founders) Are Back Speaking To Community Organizations And Churches In-person!

It has been a long wait for community groups/organizations and churches to resume in person meetings. However, it appears that the general public are finally feeling comfortable to mix and mingle with others.
